Diploma Policy

To accomplish the educational objectives stipulated in the College of International Management College Regulations, the College of International Management has defined graduation requirements as well as the following four learning outcomes to be achieved by the time of graduation.

(Graduation Requirements)

- Students are required to enroll for the designated period and to complete at least 124 credits in accordance with the following course registration requirements.
- Complete at least 40 credits of Common Education Subjects in accordance with the following requirements:
 - 1) Japanese-basis students must complete at least 24 credits of English Language Education Subjects, and English-basis students must complete at least 16 credits of Japanese Language Education Subjects. However, students may be exempted from taking Language Education Subjects based on their language ability upon entry.
 - 2) Complete at least 6 credits of Required Subjects established by APM.
- Complete at least 62 credits of APM Major Education Subjects including at least 18 credits in Required Major Education Subjects.
- Domestic Japanese-basis students must complete at least 20 credits of Common Liberal Arts Subjects or Major Education Subjects offered in English.
- Detailed course registration requirements shall be stipulated in the College of International Management College Regulations.

(Learning Outcomes)

1. Value "Business Ethics and Social Responsibility"

- 1-a. Understand the principles of business ethics and social responsibility.
- 1-b. Demonstrate ability to make professional decisions by applying the principles of business ethics and social responsibility.

Curriculum Policy (Curriculum Design Policy and Curriculum Implementation Policy)

(1) Curriculum Design Policy

(Subject Placement: General)

- The curriculum is divided into Common Education Subjects and Major Education Subjects, and is designed for four years.

(Subject Placement: Common Education Subjects)

- Common Education Subjects are divided into Language Education Subjects and Common Liberal Arts Subjects. The Language Education Subjects consist of English, Japanese, AP languages (Chinese, Korean, Malay/Indonesian, Spanish, Thai or Vietnamese) and Specific Subjects.
- Common Liberal Arts consist of APU Literacy, Introduction to Major Studies, and Global Citizens Foundation.
- The APU literacy field is a group of subjects for students to deepen their knowledge in Japan and overseas, which is necessary for students of this university, and acquire a methodology for deepening their learning by making the most out of the multicultural environment of this university.
- The Introduction to Major Studies field is a subject group that will introduce specialized learning in each college.
- The Global Citizens Foundation field will be assigned as a diverse group of subjects that do not fall within the framework of undergraduate specialized education for cultivating rich knowledge and culture in the fields of humanities, social sciences, and natural sciences.

(Subject Placement: Major Education Subjects)

- Major Education Subjects are divided into Required Subjects, Seminar Subjects, APM Common Subjects, and Subjects for the Area of Study. Major Education Subjects for the Area of Study are divided into: Strategic Management and Leadership; Marketing; Accounting and Finance; and Entrepreneurship and Operations Management.
- Required Subjects are designed for understanding and applying fundamental business concepts. They provide a solid grounding in each Area of Study of APM.
- Seminar Subjects are designed for developing the knowledge and skills in their field of interest in a small group format.
- APM Common Subjects are designed for acquiring specialized and practical knowledge and experiences irrespective of the Area of Study. They also include off-campus study programs such as Business Internship and Field Study under the theme of global business immersion, creating social impact through business, and bridging theory and practice.
- Subjects for the Area of Study are designed for developing the knowledge in the four Areas of Study which make up APM education.

(2) Curriculum Implementation Policy

(Subject Offerings)

- Offer subjects listed in the College of International Management College Regulations in both Japanese and English in principle, to allow students to enroll, take classes and graduate in either English or Japanese while also learning the opposite language.
- Expand the Off-campus Study Programs offered in accordance with both University and APM policies.
- All subjects are offered in the semester, day and period which allow students to take full advantage of structured learning.

(Subject Operation)

- All subjects are operated in compliance with the Standards for Establishment of Universities and the University Regulations. In addition, based on the methods applied in the subject, factors such as the educational outcomes and necessary studies outside of the class hours are also taken into account.
- Each subject is operated in accordance with the Curriculum Map and each syllabus is designed to guide students in achieving the Learning Goals and Learning Objectives set for the subject.
- All subjects are aimed at achieving Multi-cultural Cooperative Learning by taking full advantage of APU's multicultural environment and education, and encouraging interactive collaboration between International and Domestic students.
- Instructors are required to comply with guidelines related to the subject operation including administration of Class Evaluation Surveys, response to Grade Inquiries, and holding Make-up Classes.

Students must be enrolled at APU for at least four years.

Graduation Requirement 2: Complete at least 124 credits in total

Students must earn a total of at least 124 credits to graduate.

However, even if a student has earned 124 credits overall, they cannot graduate if they have not fulfilled any of graduation requirements 3 to 8.

Graduation Requirement 3: Complete all required language subjects (or be exempted from required language subjects)

The number of required credits for English or Japanese Language Subjects differs between students based on the results of the placement test taken after enrollment. APU automatically registers and assigns students to these classes until they earn credits for all their required language subjects.

[English] Required Language Subjects for Japanese-Basis Students

- Students can only proceed to the next level after earning credits for both English A and B at a given level. Students who fail either subject A or B cannot proceed to the next level. (For example, if a student passes English A but fails B, then they will only be registered for English B again in the next semester.)
- At all levels, English A is worth 4 credits and English B is worth 2 credits.

Graduation Requirement 4: Fulfill the credit requirements for each subject field

- Of the 124 credits required for graduation, students need to earn 102 credits in specific subject fields (Graduation Requirements 3 and 5-8).
- Although students are required to complete 102 credits in the set subject fields, they can complete the remaining 22 credits (124 credits – 102 credits) in any subject field they are interested in.
- Depending on each student’s starting level for required language subjects, the number of required credits for “English/Japanese Language Subjects” and “Language Education Subjects and/or Common Liberal Arts Subjects” will change. However, all students are still required to earn a total of 102 credits in the required subject fields.

Graduation Requirement 5: Complete at least 20 credits of subjects held in English (Japanese-basis domestic students only)

Japanese-basis domestic students must complete at least 20 credits of Common Liberal Arts or Major Education Subjects (either from their own college or another college) held in English.

Japanese-basis students must fulfil the following requirements in order to register for subjects held in English.

English Track	Requirements for Taking Subjects Held in English
Standard Track (JST)	Complete credits for or be exempted from "Intermediate English A/B"
Advanced Track (JAT)	No specific requirements. Can register for subjects held in English from their 1st semester.

(NOTE)

- Language Education Subjects and subjects held in both English and Japanese (E/J) do not count towards this total.
- Japanese-basis international students do not need to complete this requirement for graduation.
- Even if your residence status (domestic/international) changes after enrollment, your curriculum and graduation requirements do not change.
- The subject "Bridge Program" counts as a subject held in English.

Subject Outline	<p>Bridge Program is a Common Liberal Arts Subject where students study a wide variety of liberal arts topics while improving their English ability.</p> <p>This subject was established to serve as the first step towards students taking regular classes held in English.</p> <p>Students cannot register for this subject again if they have already earned credits for it before.</p>
Eligibility	Only Japanese-basis domestic students on the English Standard Track can register for this subject.
Registration Restrictions	<p>Available after completing "Pre-Intermediate English A & B" and before completing "Upper-Intermediate English A & B".</p> <p>The classes are separated by college, so students cannot register for the "Bridge Program" of other colleges.</p> <p>Students who want to take this subject should register for it themselves during one of the course registration periods.</p>

- The university will register students for "Introduction to Economics" in their enrollment language.
- APU normally registers students for this subject in their 2nd semester. However, students can register for this subject by themselves during their 1st semester if they have enough credits available. If a student registers for this subject early and successfully earns the credits, then APU will not register them for this subject in their 2nd semester.

Graduation Requirement 8: Complete all required APM Major Education Subjects (9 subjects, 18 credits)

APM students must earn credits for all of the following subjects to graduate.

- The university will automatically register and assign students to these classes until they earn credits for all the required subjects.
- The university will register students for these subjects in their enrollment language.

*Notes about "Introduction to Marketing" and "Finance":

- APU normally registers students for these subjects in their 2nd semester. However, students can register for these subjects by themselves during their 1st semester if they have 16 or less credits of automatically registered subjects in their 1st semester (they have enough credits available). If a student registers for any of these subjects early and successfully earns the credits, then APU will not register them for that subject in their 2nd semester.

Prerequisite Subjects

Some subjects have set “prerequisite subjects” to ensure that students register for courses in a systematic manner. If the prerequisite subject is listed on the “Subject List”, students must earn credits for the set prerequisite before they can register for this subject. The required APM Major Education Subjects are prerequisites for many other APM Major Education Subjects.

APM Areas of Study *Not a graduation requirement

The College of International Management has established the following four Areas of Study in order to support the development of future business people with high professional ethics and the ability to discover and resolve management issues. Students will acquire knowledge of management and a deep understanding of diverse societies, cultures, and traditions and also interact with individuals from a variety of backgrounds in the world of international business.

APM Areas of Study
Strategic Management & Leadership (SML)
Marketing (M)
Accounting & Finance (AF)
Entrepreneurship & Operations Management (EOM)

Major

- APM students can register one of the four Areas of Study as their Major.
- If a student completes 16 or more credits from among the designated subjects for their registered Area of Study (including up to 4 credits for seminar subjects), then the name of that Area of Study will be noted as their Major on their diploma.
- If a student does not fulfil the above requirements, then no Area of Study will be noted on their diploma.

Minor

- APM students can also register one of the other Areas of Study as a Minor.
- Students can only register one Minor.
- If a student completes 12 or more credits from among the designated subjects for the Area of Study they registered as their Minor (including up to 4 credits for seminar subjects), then the name of that Area of Study will be noted as their Minor on their diploma.
- If a student does not fulfil the above requirements, then the name of their Minor will not be noted on their diploma.
- Furthermore, a student’s Minor will only be noted on their diploma if they have also fulfilled all the requirements for their Major. If a student only fulfils the requirements for their Minor, and not their Major, then neither the name of their Major or their Minor will be noted on their diploma.

Students who want to obtain CPA, CFA or CMA certification

"Accounting and Finance (AF)" major students who plan to pursue CPA, CFA, or CMA certification are recommended to complete 20 or more credits in AF Major Education Subjects, excluding "Accounting I", "Finance", and seminar subjects.

Number of Credits Earned from Distance Learning Courses

Number of Credits from "Distance Learning Courses" Included in Credits Counted Toward Graduation

A maximum of 60 credits earned from Distance Learning Courses may be counted toward graduation.

Under the Standards for the Establishment of Universities and APU's University Regulations, the maximum number of credits from Distance Learning Courses that can be counted towards graduation for undergraduate students is 60 credits. Please note that if a student earns more than 60 credits, the additional credits will not count toward the number of credits needed for graduation. External Exams (Benchmark Test) included in the Grade Evaluation for Required English Courses

The results of external exams are included in the grade evaluation of some required English language courses. These external exams can be used as useful indicators for measuring the results of each student's English learning, and aid students in gaining comprehensive English skills that can be used in this era of globalization. Japanese-basis Standard Track students taking required English courses must take the Benchmark Test on campus on the designated exam dates.

What is the Benchmark Test?

The Benchmark Test is Pearson's computer-based test of English language proficiency that is designed to show learner progress in the language over a period of time. It is an integrated-skills test, including Reading, Writing, Speaking, Listening. As well as giving detailed feedback to students on all of these language skills, the Benchmark Test provides students with a Global Scale of English (GSE) score.

Language Study Outside the Classroom

To further improve your language skills, APU offers a wide range of short-term programs during summer and winter holidays, as well as six-month and one-year overseas language training and study abroad programs. Students are also strongly encouraged to take the TOEFL ITP®, TOEIC® Listening and Reading Test and IELTS, which are conducted on campus, as an opportunity to objectively assess their English language skills. Exemption from English Language Courses

Students at APU are required to take language courses in their non-basis language as a graduation requirement. The starting level of these required language subjects is determined by the placement test taken at the time of enrollment. However, in the following cases it is possible to apply for an exemption for English language subjects.

While in APU

【Application Criteria】

- ① The student must not apply for a subject which they are taking in the semester of application.
- ② The student has obtained a valid score on either the TOEFL iBT® Test, IELTS, PTE Academic, or the TOEIC® Test which fulfills the exemption criteria.

【Exemption Criteria】

- ① The student must earn a passing grade (A + /A/B/C) for their registered English subjects.

While studying abroad or taking a leave of absence

[Application criteria]

- ① A pass grade for all registered English subjects in the semester immediately before leaving for study abroad or taking leave of absence.
- ② The student must have a valid score on the TOEFL iBT® Test, IELTS, PTE Academic or TOEIC® Test, which fulfills the exemption criteria.
- ③ Students must apply for an exemption during the semester immediately preceding their return to APU.

- Lack of score from a designated exam

- Does not attend interview on the designated day (for any reason)

If you do not fulfill this attendance requirement, you will receive an automatic failing grade (F) for the course.

Absences

If you are not present at the time class attendance is taken, you will be marked absent. However, absences may be excused in the following cases:

You must submit a certificate from a medical institution stating that you have contracted a legally-recognized infectious disease to the Academic Office. The Academic Office will contact your course instructor directly in the following days.

6. Common Education Subjects (Common Liberal Arts Subjects)

The subjects available at APU are divided into Common Education Subjects and Major Education Subjects. Common Education Subjects include Language Education Subjects and Common Liberal Arts Subjects, with Language Education Subjects further subdivided into 4 areas: English Language Subjects, Japanese Language Subjects, AP Language Subjects, and Special Lecture Subjects.

6-1. What are Common Liberal Arts Subjects?

All Common Liberal Arts Subjects are sorted into three subject fields. Subjects that fall under Common Liberal Arts include ones that aim to cultivate cultured and knowledgeable students as well as foundation subjects that serve as an introduction to each college's major subjects.

Common Liberal Arts Subjects

Field	Outline
APU Literacy	APU aims to be a global learning community where its diverse student body, composed of students with diverse cultural and social backgrounds from all over Japan and the world, can grow and develop while deepening their mutual understanding towards each other. By studying subjects in this field, students can acquire the methodologies needed to enrich their studies and make the most of APU's multicultural environment as they deepen their understanding of Japan and the Asia Pacific region, where the majority of students come from.
Introduction to Major Studies Group	The subjects in this field are foundation subjects that serve as an introduction to specialized study in each of the three colleges. Most of these subjects are required subjects for each college, and students should take them as early as possible to gain a foundation in their university studies.
Global Citizens Foundation	In order to become global changemakers, APU students must be knowledgeable and well-versed in the humanities, social sciences, and natural sciences. This field includes a variety of subjects that do not fall under the specialties of APU's three colleges. Furthermore, students also need to be able to logically formulate ideas based on data and communicate with the world using ICT. This subject field also includes subjects that serve as the foundation for acquiring these skills.

6-2. SSW & MCW

Student Success Workshop

Aim

This course aims to equip first-year students with academic skills and the skills and mindsets to study independently, autonomously, and cooperatively to be successful in various academic and social experiences at university.

Class Method

In the first half of the semester, students learn about learning together with others and coordinating studying on their own through readings and discussions. In the second half of the semester, students learn in a practical way how to find academic resources, how to write academically, and the difference between plagiarism and citing. Lastly, students listen to the stories of senior students and graduates invited as guest speakers, and set goals to increase their motivation to study. This class makes extensive use of group learning by dividing students into small groups, with undergraduate TAs acting as facilitators.

Multicultural Cooperative Workshop

Aim

Working cooperatively with people from different cultural backgrounds is everyday practice at APU and has become commonplace in today's globalized society. This course aims to equip first-year students with the basic skills and attitudes for intercultural communication and cooperative learning required in such settings.

Class Method

This class is based on a combination of lectures provided by faculty members and workshops facilitated by teaching assistants (TAs). In principle, the lectures will be held in large classrooms separated by Japanese and English language bases, and the workshops will be held in small classrooms mixing Japanese and English language bases. In these work shops, students will be further divided into small groups mixing Japanese and English language bases to focus on acquiring skills and attitudes related to intercultural learning and multicultural cooperation. In the second half of the course, students will work on a group project while applying such skills and attitudes, and present their group project during a final presentation event.

Required Subjects		These subjects help students understand and apply fundamental business concepts and provide a solid grounding in each of the APM Areas of Study.
Area of Study Subjects	Strategic Management & Leadership (SML)	This specialization teaches students about strategic management concepts, skills, and competencies, including strategy formulation, resource management, and leadership.
	Marketing (M)	Students learn how to build brands, develop products and services, set pricing and promotion strategies, develop digital business and marketing, and manage customer relations and distribution systems.
	Accounting & Finance (AF)	These subjects cover accounting, which determines the state of company through the flow, increase, and decrease of money, as well as the procurement and management of capital, which is known as finance. Students are taught how to understand and manage the finances of companies and various other types of organizations.
	Entrepreneurship & Operations Management (EOM)	Students gain the knowledge, skills, and mindset needed to create and operate new companies and organizations, including learning about how to identify business opportunities, business model development, project management, and the entrepreneurial mindset.
APM Common Subjects		These subjects help students acquire specialized and practical knowledge and experience regardless of their Area of Study.

7-2. Seminar Subjects

Seminar courses are held in small groups. For this reason, students can choose their seminar course from the syllabus and deepen their learning on a topic of their interest. In 4th year seminars, students write a graduation thesis as a culmination of their four years of study. Seminars are not required courses.

In order to take a seminar course, students must: (1) Choose a seminar of their choice, (2) Interview with the instructor of the seminar, and (3) Follow the application procedures and pass the screening process. APU's application procedures and seminar course registration system are complex to allow flexibility in meeting the needs of students at various stages of their studies.

For this reason, it is very important to understand basic information about seminar registration.

2nd Year Seminars (Research Design and Methodology)

In this course, students receive an explanation of the values, ethics, and scope of the research process. Students will explore and consider various research designs and methods used by researchers and professionals in the fields of business and management. In class, students will discuss approaches for various approaches including how to carry out literature reviews to identify gaps in research, formulate research questions for consideration, use theories to form hypotheses, classify the appropriate data to be collected and analyzed, and put together a research paper. The course aims to improve students' research and analytical skills, and is strongly recommended for students who wish to join 3rd year seminars and 4th year Graduation Research. (Note: "Research Design and Methodology" is a prerequisite for registering for "Undergraduate Thesis.")

3rd Year Seminars

Students interested in going on to enroll in graduate school or finding employment in Japan after graduation are strongly encouraged to register for a small-group 3rd year seminar. Although the content of each seminar will vary, the main goal of all 3rd year seminars is the same: (1) to deepen students' understanding of a specific field through case studies, journal articles, and debate, and (2) to master the specialized knowledge and skills necessary for writing and undergraduate thesis.

【Grade Evaluation】

Letter Grade (A+, A, B, C, F)

APM [Major Seminar]

In APM Major Seminar, students study actual cases to learn about corporate behavior and the business world.

In class, discussions are held on topics such as accounting and finance, marketing, strategic management and organization, and innovation and economics. To build up their basic knowledge, students will first research a topic designated by the course instructor, then discuss that topic in class. Students will later select their own individual topics to research, and find the best ways to solve the associated problems.

4th Year Seminars

This course aims to have students make the most of the knowledge and techniques they have gained up through their third year to write an undergraduate thesis as a culmination of their 4 years of study. Students spend a year researching a topic they are interested in, and complete their theses in the second half of the year. In this course, students take "Advanced Seminar" (2 credits) in the first half of their 4th year, and if they receive a P (Pass) grade, in the second half of the year they take "Undergraduate Thesis" (4 credits) or "Graduation Project" (4 credits). If students receive an 'F' (Fail) grade in the 'Advanced Seminar,' they will not be eligible to register for the 'Undergraduate Thesis' or 'Graduation Project' (for writing the undergraduate thesis or developing the graduation project). Furthermore, it is essential that the academic field selected for the 'Advanced Seminar' aligns with the field chosen for the 'Undergraduate Thesis' or 'Graduation Project'. Additionally, to register for the undergraduate thesis, besides obtaining credits in the "Advanced Seminar" in the same academic field as the undergraduate thesis, it is also necessary to earn valid credits in 'Research Design and Methodology' as a prerequisite.

【Grade Evaluation】

Advanced Seminar: P (Pass) or F (Fail)

Undergraduate Thesis: Letter Grade (A+, A, B, C, F)

APM [Undergraduate Thesis]

Students will use the knowledge and techniques they have learned over their 4 years of study to write an undergraduate thesis. For the undergraduate thesis, students will choose a topic and carry out surveys, research, and analysis under the guidance of their instructor. Students will make the most of the knowledge, skills, analytical methods, and other tools they have acquired so far to actively explore their chosen topic. Expected learning in this course includes:

- Integrating all the information and skills learned so far to actively conduct the research / project
- Carrying out analysis and using problem-solving skills by making use of the appropriate tools

* Must complete "Research Design and Methodology" to register for the course.

APM [Graduation Project]

Students will use the knowledge and techniques they have learned over their 4 years of study to create a Graduation Project. In the Graduation Project, students will choose a topic and carry out surveys, research, and analysis under the guidance of their instructor. Students will make the most of the knowledge, skills, analytical methods, and other tools they have acquired so far to actively explore their chosen topic. Expected learning in this course includes:

- Integrating all the information and skills learned so far to actively conduct the research / project
- Carrying out analysis and using problem-solving skills by making use of the appropriate tools

8. Application to take APM Required Subjects in Opposite Language

In principle APM required subjects are automatically registered by the university for students in their language of enrollment. In other words, English-basis students take classes in English and Japanese-basis students take classes in Japanese. However, English-basis students can apply to take APM required subjects in Japanese if they meet the requirements. If you would like to apply for this, please check the application guidelines below.
