

Online Seminar Invitation: Politics and International Relations in Southeast Asia amid the COVID-19 Pandemic

Join academics from Japan, Singapore, and Malaysia in a discussion about international security, diplomatic and international maritime law issues in the South China Sea dispute, and domestic political issues in the current context of the coronavirus pandemic.

BEPPU CITY, Oita Prefecture, Japan – International relations, security, and politics are in a balanced state of constant tension. As the world grapples with the COVID-19 pandemic and the spread of the coronavirus, how does this affect the relationships between countries? Join Ritsumeikan APU Professor Yoichiro Sato as he moderates a discussion and Q&A session with academics from Singapore and Malaysia for an RCAPS* seminar.

The seminar, to be held on the Zoom online meeting platform, will discuss international security, diplomatic and international maritime law issues in the South China Sea dispute, and domestic political issues in the current context of the coronavirus pandemic.
